Please find following a list of some studies that are currently open to recruitment in the ClinTrial Refer database.

A Phase 1/2, Open-Label, Dose-Escalation and Expansion Study of the Bruton Tyrosine Kinase-Targeted Protein-Degrader BGB-16673 in Patients With B-Cell Malignancies

The BGB 16673-101 study's key objective is to establish efficacy of this drug in participants who have an unmet need. This study is currently enrolling participants with B-Cell Malignancies, in particular participants with Mantle Cell Lymphoma (MCL).

The key eligibility criteria include a proven diagnosis of MCL; an available tumour block or unstained slides for future pathology central review; MCL disease that is currently relapsed or refractory to last line


of therapy or intolerance to it; measurable disease; no central nervous system involvement; adequate organ functions (heart, liver, kidney); and importantly, prior treatment by both a covalent BTKi (such as zanubrutinib, ibrutinib, acalabrutinib) and an anti-CD20 antibody (such as rituximab).

Slots are also available for participants with CLL (Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia) or SLL (Small Lymphocytic Leukemia), marginal zone lymphoma, Richter transformation, Waldenström macroglobulinemia, follicular lymphoma, and non-GCB diffuse large B-cell lymphoma.


