This month we introduce you to the wonderful **Jennifer Harman** who is the **App Manager** for the **Haematology NSW & ACT App**.

Q. Tell us about the ClinTrial Refer Haematology NSW & ACT App

"The Haematology NSW & ACT App supplies a current list of active and pending haematology clinical research trials in NSW and the ACT. The App is supported by the Clinical Research Unit at Concord Repatriation General Hospital's Department of Haematology which was established in 2005 and is part of Concord Cancer Centre.

The Concord Haematology Department delivers world-class tertiary Haematology clinical care, supported by active clinical, translational, and basic research.

Our Clinical Research Unit is led by Dr Nicole Wong Doo (Director), Tafline Walker (Business Operations Manager) and myself Jennifer Harman (Manager). Our unit is staffed by a Clinical Coordination Division of five Registered Nurses and five Clinical Research Coordinators, all with tertiary science qualifications. Our highly skilled Business Operations Division efficiently meet our regulatory and reporting obligations, and support the team in various high-level administrative functions, in clinical trials governance and financial management. Ten haematologist investigators are supported by several clinical research fellows.

Our broad portfolio is particularly strong in trials in lymphoproliferative diseases. As a national leader in accessing emerging therapies, our unit has a high proportion of patients referred for clinical trial participation both within Sydney and across NSW and ACT.

Through the ClinTrial Refer App we support access to cutting edge Haematology treatments across several locations within NSW and ACT to make it easier for doctors and patients to find trials".

Q. Tell us a little bit about yourself/your role in addition to managing the App.

"I am the manager of the Haematology Clinical Research Unit at Concord Hospital. I started in the unit many years ago as a registered nurse, but am now responsible for looking after the amazing, dedicated team here at Concord".

Q. Why do you think Clinical trials are important?

"Clinical Trials are important because ultimately, they improve the health and wellbeing of us all. As a nurse, I have seen many treatments change throughout the years I have been working in health. It has been amazing to see over the years what treatments have changed through the clinical trials we have been involved in and how it has had a positive impact on our patients lives".


Q. If you could wave a magic wand and change one thing in clinical trials what would it be?

"Easier access to clinical trials for rural & remote patients. My mum was on a clinical trial after her cancer relapsed back in 2016. Her treating doctor knew what I did as a job, so knew she would be open to the opportunity of a clinical trial, even one 5 hours from her home. Every three weeks she would travel from a small town inland from Port Macquarie, down to Sydney to receive her treatment. My kids were lucky, they had Grandma down to visit every three weeks. Through the clinical trials we were blessed with another two great years with her. She was there to see my youngest child born. My second child start school. Countless memories were made and most importantly for us, we had time. Time to spend together, time to prepare ourselves, time for us to adjust. As a family, we are forever grateful for what being involved in a clinical trial gave us".

Q. What's your favorite thing to do outside of work and making potentially life changing clinical trials more available to people that might need them?

"I am also a mum with three children. Life is mostly consumed by their activities, but I do love to bake. Sticky Cinnamon Scrolls were something my family say I perfected during COVID times".





